Today this must-see London landmark is a popular visitor attraction and home to the magnificent Painted Hall, one of the finest Baroque interiors in Europe; epic art installations, events and a world-famous film and TV location. Visitors can enjoy award-winning tours, discover Tudor archaeological finds and explore the Christopher Wren-designed buildings and beautiful riverside grounds.
	The Greenwich Foundation for the Old Royal Naval College now in its 26th year, is a charity that conserves and protects the magnificent Baroque buildings and grounds of the Old Royal Naval College for present and future generations and provides opportunities for diverse audiences to enjoy, be inspired and learn from its significance.

Respond positively to change and new ideas. To prepare, present and deliver an exciting and participatory tour experience to our visitors. To attend a series of training sessions to prepare you for the role and maintain and attend regular ongoing training as part of the role. Become familiar with and always follow the ORNC's Health and Safety Policy.

Time Expectations	Minimum of 3.5 hours per week and availability to attend all training dates prior to commencement.

Training, support and other benefits Skills and Experience	As ORNC volunteers you will receive: A full induction, in-house training, and support from experienced heritage professionals, including peer support. Regular support and supervision from the Team Leaders and the Volunteer Supervisor. Local discounts in shop and cafes. Free access to the site attractions. Travel costs of up to £15 per day will be reimbursed based on Oyster card/travel receipts. £3.50 towards lunch for a five-hour shift or more. Uniform provided. Volunteers will have the opportunity to: Become part of a friendly dedicated and new team. Meet people from all walks of life and make new friends. Enjoy new experiences whilst sharing a passion for history and the ORNC. Develop public speaking and story-telling skills. Interested in working with a wide variety of people. Good communication, literacy, and storytelling skills. Attention to detail. Pleasant friendly manner, polite under pressure. Ability to present to an audience and keep to time limits. Ability to adapt to changing circumstances. Experience of working with public an advantage. Able to prioritise appropriately. Reasonably fit as some walking, stair climbing, and lifting of objects involved.
